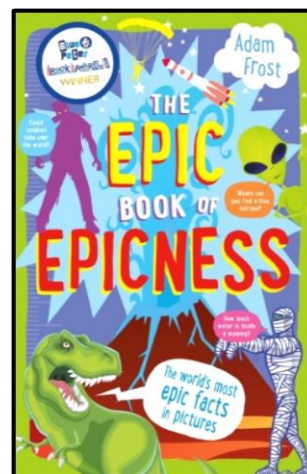
## Reading Corner
