As the temperatures continue to hover just above freezing, I would like to remind all of our parents and families about our school procedures should we receive any substantial snow fall in the coming weeks. The school will endeavour to remain open in the first instance and that closing the school will only ever be chosen in the final instance. Please can I ask that you do not contact the school office, asking if we are open as we will always use our main methods of communication in the event of such a decision. You will all receive a text message and the school Twitter account will also be used to state that this decision has been made. We hope that we are not required to close and that such a decision has to take into consideration many factors, not just the amount of snow on the school grounds. Safety of parents and families and their journey to school, the travelling situation of staff (many of whom travel some considerable distances through remote areas) and of course the current weather forecast and advice provided all play a part. Many thanks for your understanding in this matter.

Morning Punctuality

As the year has progressed, it has become noticeable that a number of our families have begun to struggle with the children's punctuality in the morning. The school gates are open from 8.30am and the doors open at 8.45am. The final bell rings at 8.55am for the start of the school day and children are still arriving after this time. Please can I ask you to re-evaluate your morning routines if this applies to you and consider ways in which you can educate your child on the importance of punctuality. I am also aware that it is not always the fault of the children that many are late, although traffic congestion can sometimes play a part. However, many of our families do walk to school from the local community and therefore, please can I ask you to aim to arrive at school on time. Please note that this is merely a polite request and is not something that we should need to continue to offer reminders for.

David Wilson Homes – Building Buddies Project

Two creative pupils at our school have been crowned the winners of the first two activities in David Wilson Homes' academic year long Building Buddies Award scheme. The first two tasks included getting the pupils to invent their own housing development and logo and then they were asked to write a short piece to market their new development. Both winners were each presented with a £25 book token as prizes at the halfway stage of the project. EYFS Firefighters Visit




Gary’s Banana Drama
