### School Ties

However, as of this week, I have now secured a new supplier, who will be able to deliver the ties over the summer break and more crucially, at a cheaper price! Therefore, the school will still be introducing the compulsory tie, as requested by the school council and these will be on sale in both playgrounds for the whole of the first week back, starting on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September, I will also text and tweet a reminder on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September. 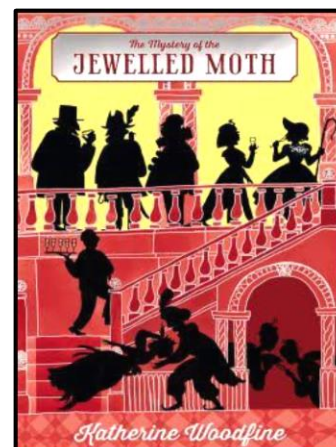
This week's recommended read is for children 8 and above...
