As always, the learning opportunities designed by our creative teachers have resulted in plenty of fun but fabulous learning. 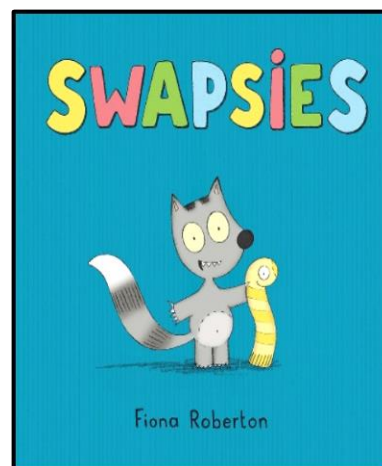
### Swapsies
