Anti-Bullying Findings

Mrs Wheeler, as our teacher responsible for personal, social and moral education has completed some interesting work on capturing the pupils' feelings and thoughts regarding the picture of bullying at school. Next week is National Anti-Bullying week and to ensure that teachers are accurately targeting areas of need in their lessons next week, we felt that listening to pupils' views was an essential task. Pupils were able to name the many different types of bullying, inclusive of cyber bullying and of the pupils spoken to, all knew the importance of speaking out and talking to a trusted adult. They like the current system that the school has in place, including the class worry and thought boxes as well as stating that, *"adults deal effectively with bullying and it is talked about in assemblies and lessons to make sure we are aware of it and this helps us to understand why bullying should never happen."*

Some points for consideration have been raised by the children including that, *"some adults could listen to our views better than others"* and *"it would be good to have a group created which could focus on stopping bullying full stop."* As a school, we will act upon the pupil voice and act quickly over the coming weeks. 
Reading Corner
