### Year 5/6 France Trip

After what seemed like a long day of travelling, the children soon settled in to their dormitories. It wasn't long before they were sampling some French cuisine and making their own croissants (which looked delicious by the way!)




Their first full day in France began with some archery, fencing and climbing before the staff and children set off on an excursion to the beautiful historic city of Rouen. Here, they spent the day in awe and wonder as they explored the Notre Dame Cathedral of Rouen and learnt about Jeanne de Arc and the history of the city. They left just enough time for some retail therapy as they explored the shops, architecture and cafes



in Rouen.

The next day was a little more thought-provoking for the children as they made a trip to Wellington Quarry in the French city of Arras. They listened in silent wonder at the stories and experiences of the allied troops in 1917. They found it quite haunting exploring Exit 10 used by NZ on the morning of the surprise attack and looking at the artwork that still exists from the allied troops. In the afternoon they had a tour around the Vimy Ridge trenches, experiencing what life would have been like for a World War I soldier and payed their respects to over 44,000 German soldiers who lost their lives in the war.





Their final full day in France was no less busy than the others! After another early start they were soon making their way to the market, where the man selling the sunglasses made a killing! I hope the children remembered their French! They then moved on for a trip to the beach (luckily the weather was nice) before making their way to a farm to see how goat's cheese is made! No wonder they were shattered on the coach on the way back!

They are making their way back now as we speak, from what has been the trip of a lifetime! I know many of you parents have missed them dearly and are looking forward to welcoming them back but I know you will want to join me in expressing a HUGE thank you to all the staff who have accompanied them on the trip this week and kept us up-to-date with tweets and texts. I'm sure you will have a very restful and quiet weekend...



### Year 5/6 French Theme Week

For the small proportion of pupils in Year 5 and 6 who were not able to go to on the school trip, France has been brought to them as they have participated in their own French themed week! It began with a visit from local television presenter Rosella Cottrell, who introduced them to a parchment craft kit so that they could make their own cards. They also had their own World War I themed day and made a trip to the National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas. 
## Ronald McDonald Charity Day


