Sports Premium Report

Shobnall Primary School appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

The whole team is committed to ensuring that all pupils receive a minimum of 2 hours of PE per week, delivered by well-trained and enthusiastic teachers. The Sport Premium funding allows us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing children's physical literacy skills.

Please note that 7/12 of funding allocation received by LA on 31st October 2017 = £10,512
5/12 of the remaining funding allocation received by LA on 30th April 2018 was £7,508

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding in excess of £415 million per annum provide substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. This money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- This report will be updated at the end of each academic year to identify the success of the above initiatives and the impact that they have had.
- Delivery will be monitored by the PE Leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at senior level by the Headteacher and Deputy Head.
- Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by school staff, volunteers and outside agencies to ensure that provision is of high quality.
