WHERE IS CHÂTEAU DE CHANTEREINE?



- **Set in the heart of the picturesque town of Criel-sur-Mer, an old fishing village in Upper Normandy, the charming 17th century Château de Chantereine stands majestically in four acres of beautiful private grounds. The Château is ideally situated at the border of the Normandy and Picardy regions. The ancient region of Picardy is home to historic monuments and sites, including the Battlefields of the Somme, while Normandy has a distinctive character of its own, with beautiful chalky cliffs, busy seaside resorts and traditional fishing ports.**
- **When we're not out exploring the sites and culture of France, our group will be able to unwind at the Château and bond as a team with a selection of adventure activities on offer. More about this later...**

WHAT ARE OUR OBJECTIVES FOR OUR STAY AT CHÂTEAU DE CHANTEREINE?

- **TEAM WORK** – Taking part in activities that promote working together, communication and co-operation.
- **PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT** – Taking part in activities that focus on personal achievement, such as conquering fears or learning or practising a new skill or sport.
- **LEADERSHIP** – Developing leadership skills by appointing leaders to set tasks, or encouraging them to set an example.
- **SOCIAL AWARENESS** – Promoting inclusion of self and others as well as learning to recognise others attributes and achievements.
- **INITIATIVE** – Problem solving and group decision making.
- **CULTURE** – Providing a genuine and real experience of another culture.



SAFETY, SECURITY & WELLBEING

- **There are fully trained and qualified staff based permanently at the centre, who lead the activities and help the children settle in.**
- **All staff who work at the centre are DBS checked, vetted, inducted and trained to the highest levels.**
- **All staff complete a comprehensive induction programme that includes safeguarding training.**
- **Throughout their employment with Kingswood all staff are monitored to ensure compliance with our health and safety procedures.**
- **All staff wear identification badges and uniforms at all times, with all visitors and teachers required to wear a security badge.**
- **The Kingswood Duty Manager and first-aiders are on call 24 hours a day.**
- **All staff are trained in First Aid.**
- **Each member of staff receives a three-week training course to acquire the knowledge to lead the expeditions.**



SAFETY, SECURITY & WELLBEING



- **Our strict supervision policy ensures that children are always accompanied by Kingswood instructors. When on excursions, in addition to our own staff, there will be at least 6 Kingswood instructors accompanying us.**
- **Between 9.00 pm and 9.00 am and at meal and break times children are supervised by their teachers. Teachers are in loco parentis throughout the visit.**
- **Chateau de Chanteraine has secure and clearly defined boundaries and CCTV in operation.**
- **Teacher and party leader rooms are situated close to the children's.**
- **The fire alarm is directly connected to the fire station should there be an issue.**
- **Codes for the doors are changed weekly with only site staff and school staff being made aware of them.**
- **In the event of an emergency, the nearest hospital is 5.2 miles away.**



WHO WILL BE GOING?



Mr Adams, Miss Lord, Mrs Dixon, Miss Barker, Mrs Hill and Mrs Roach will be accompanying and staying with the children for the duration of their stay, day and night.

Staff from Chateau de Chantereine will be organising, leading and running each activity and excursion.

ACCOMMODATION

The children will be sharing dorms, which sleep between 3 and 8 children. Girls sleep on a separate corridor to the boys, and the teacher's rooms are located close by. The dorms are organised when we arrive, although we ask the children prior to going to nominate two friends they would like to share with. The Kingswood staff will then ensure they are with at least one.





ACCOMMODATION

There are centrally controlled light switches for all rooms from the teachers' area.

Exits are alarmed at night, which again is centrally controlled from the teachers' area.

Kingswood staff patrol regularly to check in with teachers.

CCTV is in operation 24 hours a day.





ACCOMMODATION

There are segregated toilet and shower facilities for girls and boys.





ACCOMMODATION

Each room sleeps a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8.

There are bunk beds as well as single beds in each room.

Storage to keep clothes and valuables.

The Château is alarmed at night.



WHAT WILL WE BE EATING?

- 7:30am - Every morning the children have a choice of breakfasts: toast, cereals, fruit or cooked breakfast.
- 12.00pm - 1.00pm – As we are on excursions every day, the children make and prepare their own packed lunch buffet. They are given a baguette, choice of fillings, crisps and fruit.
- 7.15pm - In the evening, they have a three course meal! All kitchen and service staff are fluent French speakers and will only interact with the children in French, therefore promoting the French being taught in school.
- All dietary requirements are catered for and the Château are already aware of these.
- There will be a halal option at every meal.

WHAT DO I NEED TO TAKE?

- **One bath towel**
